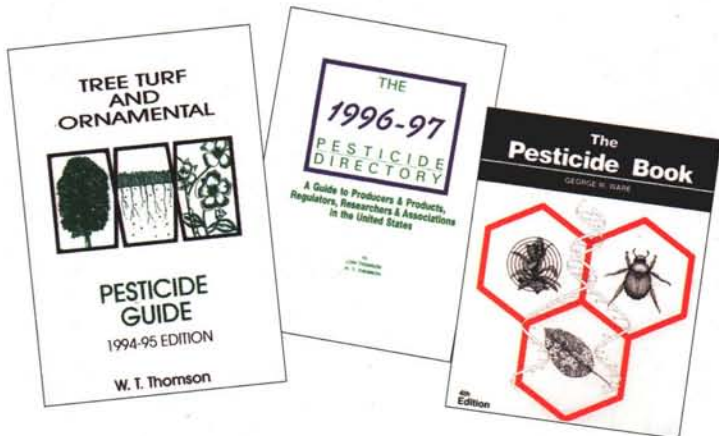

MAC Insecticide Controls Soil Pests

MACH 2, a turf insecticide developed by RohMid (a joint venture between American Cyanamid Co. and Rohm and Haas Co.), was recently registered by the U.S. EPA for use in controlling grubs and other soil-borne pests in turf. The insecticide belongs to a chemical class of molt-accelerating compounds (MACs), which interfere with the normal molting processes of targeted pests.

The product controls a variety of grubs and caterpillars, including Japanese beetles, green June beetles, oriental beetles, black turfgrass atenius, European chafers, northern and southern masked chafers, cutworms, sod webworms and armyworms.

The product will be available on a limited basis for the 1998 application season.
