
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
Rotor

Rain Bird announces its Falcon 6504 rotor. The rotor features a four-inch pop-up height and a distance of throw of 39 to 65 feet. Arc adjustments of 40 degrees to 360 degrees can be made through the top of the rotor. A radius adjustment screw allows radius reduction up to 25 percent without changing the nozzle. All nozzles are interchangeable from the front of the rotor with no special tools.

The Abacus controller offers self-prompting programming. Each zone can be independently programmed for up to four start times per day and either everyday, every other day, or odd/even day watering. The controller is remote ready and offers an optional wireless remote. The display guides the user through the programming sequence and the diagnostic LED lights inform the user of electrical problems.

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
