

John Mascaro's Photo Quiz

his photo might be easy to guess for those of you with football practices on your fields, but I think it is worth printing the photo. The brown squares on this football stadium field are the result of the dreaded ladder drill. This fine training ritual involves putting a rope ladder on the turf and having players perform various footwork drills between the rungs of the ladder. The brown marks are a result of the wear and tear on the turf. This particular college held a summer football camp in which the entire camp of over 150 players performed the drill several times without moving the ladders. Since this drill was performed on the actual playing field instead of the

practice fields, and the fact that they performed the drills near the center field also aggravated the sports turf manager. Often, strength and conditioning coaches fail to understand the importance of moving practice drills around from one area to another. During the playing season, it is hard if not impossible to get areas near the center of the field of play to recover due to the increased stress on the turf.


