STMA heads to Daytona Beach,

Florida from Jan. 15-18, 2013 for the 24th Annual STMA Conference and Exhibition. The "World Center of Racing", as Daytona Beach is known, welcomes millions of visitors every year to its varied attractions, sporting venues, restaurants, and 23 miles of beaches. Just an hour's drive to the greater Orlando area, Daytona has found its success as a year-round tourist destination because of its temperate climate, proximity to other popular Florida cities, and hosting of locations and activities of interest that are unique to the area including the Daytona International Speedway, Florida Tennis Center, Ladies Professional Golf Association International (featuring two championship courses, The Legends and The Champions), Tomoka State Park, and Halifax Harbor Marina.


