

FROM THE SIDELINES

Record rain redux

WHILE CURIOUS ABOUT how turf managers are handling the aftermath of the hurricanes that have ravaged regions in the Southeast, I haven't reached out yet to those directly affected folks out of respect for their plight. Instead here are two more stories from turfsters in my region about the record rains this year:

Dave Anderson, athletic field and grounds manager for the Hempfield (PA) SD, emailed, "Without question 2018 has been one of the most challenging years weather-wise in all my years of grounds and athletic field maintenance. We had a late March snowstorm and we had a very wet spring. There was maybe a period in early summer when things dried out. But from late July through early fall, we experienced record, intense rainfall.

Because of the rain, it was challenging to get normal maintenance activities done. We've had areas that never before had drainage issues fail to dry out completely. Our mowing schedule has been basically mow when we can, even if the grass is still wet. Topdressing and seeding was pushed back almost a month, because it was difficult to get dry topdressing material. In addition, the combination of rain and humidity has created some of the worst disease conditions for turf in a number of years. But we know that we'll deal with what the Lord has blessed us with, and look forward to getting back at it again in 2019."

And this from Dr. Doug Linde, turf management professor at Delaware Valley (PA) University, and Dr. Mike Fidanza, professor of plant and soil sciences at Penn State:

"[During August and September] soils were saturated longer than normal and there were periods of high humidity with nighttime temperatures greater than 70. Warm weather diseases such as brown patch, dollar spot, Pythium blight and gray leaf spot were more aggressive and persisted longer than normal, which was a main cause of turf death. Even the best fungicide programs could not overcome the combination of abiotic stress (i.e., persistent hot and wet weather, and low light conditions from cloud cover) and high disease pressure.

"These weather conditions also contributed to delays with mowing and other agronomic tasks, and then having to get equipment out before turf areas properly dried-down often resulted in scalping and mechanical turf damage. Because of the prolonged saturated soil conditions, many supers said, '...the (rootzone) never got a chance to drain.' And using a wetting agent, under these extreme conditions, would not necessarily help, because where's the water going to go?

"These conditions persisted until the third week of September. Normally, between mid-August and mid-September, supers are busy aerating, topdressing, seeding, and sleeping well at night because nighttime temperatures drop below 70 and grass thrives. Instead, they were making additional fungicide applications, cleaning up flood damage, and waiting to mow soggy turf areas. Finally, by the third week of September, some were able to start seeding and sodding damaged areas but were running out of daylight as days are getting shorter and the sun angle is getting lower. These conditions resulted in quicker than normal breakdown of pre-emergence herbicides used to prevent crabgrass. Finding a dry time to apply post-emergence herbicides added to the difficulty in controlling those weeds, and, in most cases, a follow-up application was needed.

"With some extra seeding and sodding and some warm fall temperatures, there is a good chance the turf should be fully recovered by mid-spring." /ST/





ASBA Certification Testing

Sat., Jan. 26, 8 am - 1 pm The American Sports Builders Association (ASBA) offers certification for field builders and will be conducting exams at the conference. Prequalification and registration is required by Dec. 15. Go to *sportsbuilders.org* or call 866-501-2722. Those testing for CFB, CFB-N or CFB-S must register for the STMA conference, purchasing a one-day package at a minimum.

CSFM Testing – New Format this Year!

Traditionally, the CSFM exam has been offered two times during the week of the Conference, in a written format. This year we will have a **NEW** online version of the CSFM Exam. Those who have prequalified to take the exam can sign up for a time slot nearly any time during the Conference that works with their schedule. 



When the Sports Turf Manager saw these guartersized clumps of soil on one of his soccer fields at this community park, he was trying to figure out what caused them. He quickly eliminated aerification cores as well as earthworms. There was no apparent damage to the turf, but the clumps were unsightly. The clumpproducing culprits turned out to be Fall Army Worms tunneling into the high-sand content athletic field to lay their eggs. The local agricultural Extension agent also confirmed this finding. As it turns out, the Fall Amy Worms like the dry sandy soils in Florida to lay their eggs. The larva pupates underground for 7 to 37 days in a cocoon they form of soil and silk. Once they emerge from the soil, the adults live for about 10 to 21 days and can eat enormous quantities of turfgrass, so the fields were treated with a Bifenthrin insecticide. The Sports Turf Manager has seen this type of activity before, but never in these types of numbers.



▶ Experience: I began working on athletic fields as a 15-year-old in high school. Several years later, I was given the opportunity to move to Supervisor of Athletic Fields on the grounds department at Liberty University. As the university has grown, I have been intentional about gaining knowledge and experience through educational courses, expert advice, and research. For 13 years, I have been responsible for the care and maintenance of Liberty University's athletic fields; currently including fields for all NCAA Division 1 practices and games, Club Sports, Intramurals, and VHSL High School athletics.

▶ Full-time staff: Kimball Chambers, Joseph Knight, Zach Horsley, Tyler Bergin, and Dakota Riley. All are full-time staff that have a role in maintaining the field here and there, but there is no one assigned to the field "full-time" other than Brian Hinkley.

- ▶ Original construction: 2015
- Turfgrass variety: Latitude 36 bermuda

• **Overseed**: We overseed in the fall at a rate of 15 lbs/1000 with a blend of perennial ryegrasses. Our process is to spread the seed several directions and then topdress with a sand matching

our rootzone to ensure good seed to soil contact. We then brush in the sand and irrigate lightly for several days until the seed has rooted.

- ▶ Rootzone: 90% sand
- Drainage: Full in field drainage with laterals on 15-foot centers.

Why should STMA consider your field a winner?

Liberty University has a rapidly growing and competitive NCAA Division 1 athletic program. Consistent with the growth at Liberty, my crew (5 full-time staff) and I have become increasingly efficient with the use of our time and resources. We are responsible for over 25 acres of natural turf and 18 acres of artificial turf used for football, baseball, soccer, softball, lacrosse, band, field hockey, intramurals, and club sports.

Osborne Stadium is home to both men's and women's soccer. We work closely with the coaches to understand their expectations for the playing surface and ensure they have access to the field when needed. Our goal is that the field is always in top condition so that it does not become a distraction to the team or the coaches.

The central location and top-notch facilities of the university make us a prime venue to host outside events. In the past year

we have hosted the Virginia Commonwealth Games, several track meets, and numerous youth soccer camps in addition to Liberty's home soccer matches. The majority of these events take place during the off-season when we are doing the bulk of our summer maintenance. It takes flexibility, clear communication, and a good deal of organization to work maintenance tasks around these events.

Player safety and playability are top priorities for us as a crew. We realize that the amount of time and effort we put into field maintenance relates directly to the athlete's experience. Consistency and attention to detail are key in accomplishing these goals. With the scope of our responsibility, there is no time to repeat maintenance practices simply because we were not paying close attention to the details. The crew has come to understand the magnitude of this responsibility and have all stepped up to the challenge.

Our desire is that when coaches, players, fans, and visitors come to Osborne Stadium they see a beautiful playing surface. We are background players, and if we do our job correctly and efficiently, they should never even know that we were involved. We believe Osborne Stadium has the best playing surface in the country, and we strive to utilize the time and resources available to us to keep the field in top condition.

SportsTurf: What attracted you to a career in sports turf management? **HINKLEY:** I loved the idea of being involved with athletics in a way that is challenging, requires a lot of science, and allows me to get my hands dirty.

ST: What are your main responsibilities?

HINKLEY: I am responsible for the management and maintenance of all athletic fields for Liberty University and Liberty Christian Academy.

ST: And what does a regular working week entail, if a "regular week" even exists?

HINKLEY: It varies by season. However, every week includes: communication with coaches and administration regarding that specific week's needs, planning meetings, laying out a work schedule for the crew, field work as needed, and game day operations.











ST: How do you keep up-to-date re emerging technologies, best practices, etc.?

HINKLEY: Industry magazines, online webinars/trainings, local and national STMA events, and Twitter have all been helpful resources for me.

ST: What changes if any did you implement for the winning field in 2018? **HINKLEY:** I added our main logo at midfield for each match, but kept most things the same in regards to field maintenance. **ST:** You know a lot of sports turf managers. What are they saying are the biggest obstacles to overcome for them to be successful today? **HINKLEY:** There's one thing that I probably hear the most, and have experienced myself: effective communication with administration. Consistent communication with administration to align our goals is at times tough, but crucial if we are to succeed together.

ST: How has your career benefitted from being a member of STMA?

HINKLEY: My career has benefitted greatly because of the enormous amount of knowledge I have gained, the relationships I have developed, and the recognition I have received.

ST: What's the greatest pleasure you derive from your job?

HINKLEY: There's nothing better than having a field in great shape for games or practice, knowing that we are providing a surface that will give our teams their best chance to perform well.


ST: What's the biggest headache?

Investing in natural grass

Q I heard that last season that the University of North Carolina used their stadium football field for all their football practices and home games plus for lacrosse. How did they manage to have their field look so good for the TV games when they only had that one field to use for everything all season?

A: This is a great question. If you happen to be attending the STMA Conference this January, you should go to "One Field, One Season: Maintaining Kenan Stadium" by Casey Carrick, CSFM, and Chad Price CSFM, CFB (Wednesday January 23). You can then hear all the details from the two guys that made this undertaking such a success. I do not want to spoil their story, but I will mention some aspects because it provides some great lessons in organization and teamwork.

I say teamwork because the successful outcome from this story was because of more than two guys. These sorts of decisions are usually made by high-level administration and require buy-in from the coaching staff. Everyone through the organization and the contractor(s) need to be on the same page and willing to be flexible if there were issues. I am sure that Casey and Chad were left to consider all the potential field-related problems so that a plan of action could be implemented as quickly and effectively as possible. So, let's dig a bit deeper in this story.

As for some background context, UNC had plans to build a new practice complex that would re-configure and re-build all the practice football fields. It just so happened the adjoining area used for lacrosse practices was also in the equation. Without practice fields, the game field became the field of choice for everything – all practices (offense and defense) and home games.

Due to the anticipated wear, a strong argument could be made to install a synthetic surface. This is an excellent use of synthetic turf since the surface can easily handle a season of repetitive practices and game-day activities with almost no perceived wear. But in this situation, a decision was made to consider the possibilities of keeping their natural grass and the implications once it began to show symptoms of wear.

There was never a question if the field would begin to degrade from excessive use. It was what to do about the damage when it did happen and could it be remedied during the season given its continued use and resulting time constraints. First, someone had to decide what steps would be necessary to bring the surface up to the high standards that everyone at UNC expected. Second, someone had to determine what labor, materials, and logistics would be required to carry out the plan. Third, someone had to calculate what all this was going to cost UNC. That "someone" had to be a collective effort of many people.

I am sure it took months of calculating from several perspectives just to decide if it was feasible while considering all the pros and cons of either decision. At some point someone had to decide it was worth the investment into an intensively managed natural grass system rather than to take what would likely be the easier solution of using synthetic turf. I should add here that this decision might not be the best solution for everyone. If any one group (administration, field managers, or coaches) thought that the field-building contractor and on-site field management staff working together could not succeed with their plan, then it could have been disastrous.

By now you know that the decision was made to replace the natural grass surface "as needed" during the season. Replacing a game field during a season has been done many times (in the NFL and/or in association with college bowl games) since the development of thick-cut sod. But that is very different than planning for multiple replacements within a season for a football field that is serving as the only available practice field and as weekend game field. Plus it was being used for other competitive sporting events.

I applaud the people's resourcefulness and ingenuity to pull everything together to make this work for the season. Because once the decision was made mid-week that a new field surface was needed, so many details had to be in place for a change-out to be successful, while keeping the field in play and available for practices. I will leave it to Casey and Chad to outline all the logistics in their talk. I think you will find that Phil Knight's comment, "There is no drama like the drama on the athletic field" equally applies to this performance. **/ST/**
