

12 THE SEARCH FOR THE PERFECT CREEPING BENTGRASS

Ever since the release of Penncross in 1955, this seeded creeping bentgrass has dominated greens construction and renovation. The introduction of a number of new varieties over the past few years has been received by superintendents and golf course architects with a certain amount of reluctance. This story reveals that universities have been breeding and evaluating hundreds of bents in their research plots for 20 years or more. Only recently have a few of these varieties been released for commercial use. The National Turfgrass Evaluation Program bentgrass trial, the first coordinated effort to compare creeping bentgrasses, will start producing results in the spring of 1991. In the meantime, a number of golf courses have begun using the new varieties with excellent results.




